Discussion: opinions on a topic, and report on learners' viewpoints

## LEARNING OUTCOMES

- articulate and defend their own opinions
- report on the opinions of peers
- improve fluency and coherence in expressing viewpoints and arguments

## EARNING ACTIVITIES

- two groups: remote and classroom learners
- each group watches one version of the video (different endings)
- small groups discuss the questions related to their version of the video
- summarize the video for the rest of the class

# Materials and tools

## **TEACHING ACTIVITIES**

- let learners choose which ending they would like to watch
- pre-teach necessary vocabulary if required
- encourage learners to predict what they think will happen before watching
- show the video 2 to 3 times
- facilitate the discussion in small groups
- check understanding during the discussion
- ask for volunteers to summarize the videos

- video with two possible endings, or alternatively, a video that exists in two versions
- or a single video where learners speculate about the possible ending

## **Tips**

• If there is only one remote learner, seat the classroom learners at a PC with headphones, and turn off the projector during the exercises
